

Appropriate Assessment Screening Determination

Customer connection at Black Valley, Derrygarriv, Co. Kerry

In accordance with Article 6(3) of the EU Habitats Directive (Directive 92/43/EEC) and Regulation 42(1) of the European Communities (Birds and Natural Habitats) Regulations 2011 as amended, ESB has undertaken Screening for Appropriate Assessment to assess, in view of best scientific knowledge and the conservation objectives of the site, if the project, individually or in combination with other plans or projects is likely to have a significant effect on a European Site(s).

The project comprises upgrade works to an existing overhead line (OHL) to facilitate a new customer connection in the townland of Black Valley, Derrygarriv, Co. Kerry.

In this context, particular attention was paid to the following European Sites, which the works are located within proximity of:

 Killarney National Park, Macgillycuddy's Reeks and Caragh River Catchment SAC (000365)¹

In accordance with Regulation 42(7) of the European Communities (Birds and Natural Habitats) Regulations 2011 as amended, ESB has made a determination following screening that an Appropriate Assessment is not required as the project is not directly connected with or necessary to the management of the sites as European sites and as it can be concluded, on the basis of objective information, that the project, individually or in combination with other plans or projects is not likely to have a significant effect on any European sites.

This determination is based on the location, scale, extent and duration of the proposed development, including temporary works and excludes any consideration of mitigation measures.

Full records of the assessment, reports, surveys, consultations and observations are held by the competent authority and available for public review as requested.
